WHEREAS, in times of war and conflict, the members of the United States military have fought and died to defeat tyranny and protect our way of life, executing their responsibilities with dedication, courage, and distinction; and

WHEREAS, answering the call to help preserve peace and promote freedom has claimed the lives of many South Carolinians who served our country heroically and with little regard for their own personal safety; and

WHEREAS, people across the Palmetto State will observe Memorial Day with their fellow South Carolinians by attending special events including parades, wreath laying ceremonies, and services of remembrance.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Henry McMaster, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim May 29, 2023, as

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to take time on this special day of remembrance to recognize and honor those Americans whose sacrifices have helped strengthen our nation and improve the quality of life for people around the world.
