Prescription Medication Storage & Disposal**

Don't keep lethal doses of medications at home and/or only fill medication for the amount needed.
Your doctor, pharmacist, or the poison control center may be able to help you determine safe quantities

Store medicine in daily doses using bags or pill containers

STORE MEDICATION SAFELY

- Place medication out of sight and reach of children.
- Put medication away every time.
- Make sure safety caps are locked.
- Teach children about medication safety.
- Ask guest to store their pills in your safe storage area.

Be particularly aware of keeping prescription painkillers (e.g., oxycodone) stored in a locked medicine cabinet due to their lethality and potential for abuse by children and unauthorized adults
